

# Bluebells double up

WEST Wallsend scored three goals in extra time to complete an undefeated season with a 4-1 win over Lambton Jaffas in a hard-fought Northern NSW First Division grand final at John-son Park yesterday.

The Bluebells had collected the minor premiership with a haul of 56 points - they had 18 wins and two draws from 20 outings - to earn promotion to the NNSW State League.

The score was not a true reflection of the tight encounter, which remained scoreless at the break. West Wallsend took the

lead in the first minute of the second half when Matt Beatty found the back of the net in a goal-mouth scramble, but the Jaffas retaliated directly through competition leading scorer Brett Macaulay.

The score was locked at 1-1 at the end of regulation time then young gun Justin Tannock decided the contest with two well-taken goals in the first period of added time.

Veteran Stuart McAteer put the final nail in the coffin for West Wallsend with a fourth goal in the final 15 minutes.
